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25 REVOLUTIONARY WAR SOLDIERS IDENTIFIED AS BURIED AT FISHKILL SUPPLY DEPOT

FISHKILL, NY (December 1, 2012) – Historical Research conducted by the not-for-profit organization **Friends of the Fishkill Supply Depot (FOFSD)** has identified the names of more than 25 soldiers believed to be buried in unmarked graves in Fishkill, NY.

The Fishkill Supply Depot (FSD) and Encampment is a National Register of Historic Places Revolutionary War site in Fishkill, NY. This strategically important site was central to the founding of the United States. Occupied for nearly the duration of the eight-year-long conflict, the FSD was a major logistical center and encampment funded by the Continental Congress. It covered 70+ acres and contained a compact city of barracks (for thousands of soldiers), officers' quarters, a prison, major hospital, armory, powder magazine, parade grounds, blacksmiths, tent shops, bake shops and other essential military facilities.

One remaining undisturbed parcel of the original FSD is threatened by commercial development. It is significant because it contains a soldier burial ground where historical records, coupled with an archeological study, indicate that several hundred (perhaps more) of our first heroes lie in unmarked graves.
