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Historic Preservation Group Identifies 26 More Soldiers at a Revolutionary War Cemetery Threatened by Commercial Development

FISHKILL, NY — In a manpower-intensive effort involving the review, analysis, and verification of individual unit muster rolls and other primary source documents, researchers with the not-for-profit organization **Friends of the Fishkill Supply Depot (FOFSD)** have identified the names of **26 additional soldiers** believed to be buried in unmarked graves at the Continental Soldiers' Cemetery in Fishkill, NY. The addition of the 26 new names raises the **total number of soldiers identified to 60**. The Soldiers' Cemetery was rediscovered in 2007 by archaeologists whose efforts revealed that hundreds of graves are present, making the Fishkill Supply Depot (FSD) site the largest single burial ground of the war.

FSD is a National Register of Historic Places Revolutionary War site in Fishkill, NY that was strategically important to General Washington and central to the founding of the United States. Occupied for nearly the duration of the eight-year-long conflict, the FSD was a major logistical center funded by the Continental Congress. It covered 70+ acres and contained a compact city of barracks (for thousands of soldiers), officers' quarters, a prison, major hospital, armory, powder magazine, parade grounds, blacksmiths, tent shops, bake shops and other essential military facilities.

One remaining, undisturbed parcel of the original FSD is privately held and in danger of commercial development; it contains not only the Soldiers' Cemetery but other period ruins identified and recorded through past archaeological examinations. Ongoing historic research conducted by FOFSD has disclosed that the graves of the following Revolutionary War heroes are located at this site:
